FORTRESS MONROE, Oct. 14.—The most brilliant display of northern lights ever observed in this section took place this evening at 7 o'clock. They were of a deep crimson color, and continued about an hour.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 14.—There was a magnificent display of the aurora borealis here tonight. The whole firmament was one blaze of crimson light, lasting for several minutes.

NEW-HAVEN, Conn., Oct. 14.—There was a grand auroral display this evening. The red light in the heavens was mistaken for a configeration, and some one sounded the fire alarm and the Department turned out.

SPRINGFIELD, Mass., Oct. 14.—A remarkably fine auroral display was witnessed by thousands

here to-night.

Norwich, Conn., Oct. 14.—There was a brilliant display of the aurora borealis here tonight, which attracted the gaze of a large number of people.

Worcester, Mass., Oct. 14.—One of the most startling and gorgeous displays of the aurora borealis over seen in this latitude was witnessed to-night. Crowds of people were in the streets to witness the spectacle.
