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Ojibway Indians Say Celestial Apparition Portends Great Events.

FORT WILLIAM, Ontario, March S.— The "Thunder Eagle," sacred among the Ojibway Indians as personifying the Great Spirit, or the Manitou, supposed to have its nest on the Sleeping Giant, 1,400 feet above Thunder Bay, was seen depicted in fire in the brilliant display of the aurora borealis here last night.

The Ojibways say the Thunder Eagle has not been seen for many years, and that its appearance portends wonderful happenings in the world. The figure of the eagle traveled swiftly southward over the bay, accompanied by huge splashes of red and green fire, which showed about it like meteors.

A dispatch from Duluth told of the appearance of an eagle in the aurora borealis seen in that city last night.

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
