Aurora Is Affecting Radio.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16 (AP).—The aurora borealis, or northern lights, is blamed for the recent erratic radio reception, particularly during the last two nights, by W. D. Terrell, chief radio inspector of the Department of Commerce. While the presence of the aurora borealis in sufficient strength to affect telegraph and telephone transmission has not been reported to the Weather Bureau, such electrical disturbances, Mr. Terrell declared, might be present even though not seen. No remedy has been found for the interference.
