Aurora Borealis Isolates West From Eastern Canada

WINNIPEG, April 14 (P).—The aurora borealis, or northern lights, played havoc with wire communications from Winnipeg to Montreal today, and for a time practically isolated the West from Eastern Canada. The strength of the aurora lessened somewhat at noon and communications were re-established.

The disturbance was the strongest in many years and effected an almost complete tie-up in telegraph communication with United States points south of here.
