Another spectacular display of the aurora borealis blazed across the northern sky in the Chicago area last night. The phenomonen, commonly called the northern lights, was described as especially brilliant by persons who called THE TRIBUNE. The lights follow a flareup of incandescent gases on the sun which sprays electrically charged particles into the earth's magnetic field. 80 to 400 miles above the ground. Light is emitted by a collision of the particles.
