SUN SPOTS AGAIN ACTIVE

Short-Wave Radio Channels to Europe Are Affected

Sunspot disturbances again intermittently blacked out short-wave communication between Europe and this country yesterday as several international channels were affected, according to reports by local radio stations.

Moscow was said by the National and Columbia networks to be the hardest to tune in for rebroadcasting here. Difficulty also was reported in picking up Rome and Ankara. It was explained that Moscow's signal had been blotted out for forty-eight hours, Rome's since late Sunday night and Ankara's from early yesterday. Communication with London was "excellent."
