World Radio Signals Fade LONDON, April 16 (Reuters) A spectacular fade-out of

radio signals all over the world occurred today, starting at about 5 A. M. Eastern Standard time and lasting from a few minutes to several hours in some areas. This type of fade-out is

named for its discoverer—an American called Dellinger—and is not uncommon during periods of high sunspot activity such as are being experienced at present.
